Wednesday, 6th March is Ash Wednesday and this marks the beginning of Lent. The season of Lent goes for forty days and is a time for Catholics to prepare for Easter. Lent is usually a time of fasting and repentance as well as a time for reflecting on Christ's suffering and sacrifices for us. #### Cuppa and Chat with Mrs Nettleton and Mrs Beggs

Parents are invited to join Mrs Nettleton and Mrs Beggs for an informal Cuppa 'n Chat in the school hall after the morning school bell at 8:30am on Wednesday 13 **March.** This is an opportunity for you to meet with other parents, our Principal and Assistant Principal for an open discussion. There is no set agenda, just come along and perhaps meet someone in our school community that you have not met before.

## Did you know that in each of the student toilet blocks, soap dispensers are

available for handwashing? In the classrooms there is liquid soap for handwashing as well as anti bacterial hand gel. Teachers remind the children to wash their hands frequently throughout the day as well as always after they use the bathroom. Should your child remark that there is no soap available in the toilets please remind him/ her to report this to their teacher or the school office. Soap dispensers are refilled



each day by our cleaners and are checked throughout the day by school staff. Please talk to your child regularly about the importance of handwashing.

#### Why is my child's teacher not in class today?

Like professionals in other fields, all teachers are required to keep up to date with current thinking on best practices and new developments in all curriculum areas. From time to time teachers are required to attend professional development opportunities to learn about changes to curriculum, new methods of teaching & learning and other ways of integrating technology. These sessions sometimes occur during the day, after school or in the school holidays. Teachers are also given time at the beginning of the year to conduct assessments to pinpoint your child's learning needs. Some teachers also have additional responsibilities which benefit the whole school. At times, teachers are also required at diocesan events etc. Teachers also have entitlements such as sick leave, long service leave, maternity leave, bereavement leave, jury duty etc. Consequently there will be times when your child's teacher is absent from the classroom. On these days the teacher's program is followed. Teachers on a grade work closely together allowing the grade partners to liaise with the substitute teacher so that good teaching and learning continues and routines are kept. St Bernadette's has an excellent pool of substitute teachers to call upon.

These teachers are familiar with our students and school protocols. We thank you for your support in this area.

#### Premier's Reading Challenge

It's that time of the year again! The Challenge begins on 4th March and continues until 30th August. The children read a set number of books from the Booklist on the website and enter them onto the PRC website.

- Yrs 3—6 read 20 books from the list and 5 books of their choosing.

Their passwords from last year are still valid. I will give class teachers a copy of these over the next two weeks. Kindergarten and new students to the school will receive their passwords within the next two weeks.

#### **Student Leave**

As part of the implementation of the formulated National Standards, holidays taken by students outside of school holiday periods will now be included in Student Attendance Data as absences. #### School Bus Travel—OPAL CARDS

Parents are reminded of the following: One of the requirements travelling on Hillsbus is the need for students to tap on and off when they travel to and from school.



Opal data gathered by tapping on and off is used to determine demand for bus services. If students don't tap on and tap off, services may be cancelled due the lack of recorded patronage.

With this in mind, we ask for your assistance in reminding your children that tapping on and off at the beginning and end of each trip is one of the conditions of using a School Opal card.
