On Thursday and Friday last week I had the great pleasure of accompanying the Year 6 students and their teachers to Canberra. This is always a fabulous excursion and our students were wonderful ambassadors of St Bernadette's and their families. As we visited Questacon, Parliament House, the High Court, the Australian Institute of Sport and the War Memorial the students demonstrated not only a keenness to learn and apply the knowledge they had but they also demonstrated a respectful attitude towards and recognition of the importance of the significant places they were visiting and the people they were meeting. The students exemplary behaviour and excellent prior knowledge were particularly noticed and commented on in each of the venues by the staff delivering the various programmes. Congratulations girls and boys I am very proud of you as are your teachers. It was very clear that you are enjoying your learning.

Our Year 3 students enjoyed an excursion to Rouse Hill House this week and again the preparation of the students for their learning and their behaviour while at the venue was commented on by the staff. Liturgical Seasons

Just as we mark our lives by anniversaries, the Church celebrates the mysteries of Christ's life in a pattern. Within the cycle of a year the Church remembers and celebrates the Paschal Mystery, the birth, life, suffering, death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. The Church's liturgical cycle recalls the Paschal Mystery over a yearly cycle. At mass we also remember the Paschal Mystery and are constantly nourished by the story of Jesus and the body

and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist. The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter.

Apart from these seasons, there are 33 or 34 weeks of the year that do not

celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ but are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period of the Church calendar is called Ordinary Time, which will begin in after Pentecost Sunday. The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green.

This Sunday we will celebrate the Ascension of our Lord which is one of the great solemnities in the Christian liturgical calendar, and commemorates the bodily ascension of Jesus into heaven. Ascension Day is traditionally celebrated on a Thursday, the fortieth day of Easter. However, some Roman Catholic provinces have moved the observance to the following Sunday. The feast is one of the ecumenical feasts (i.e. universally celebrated), ranking with the feasts of the Passion, of Easter, and Pentecost.

Attendance

As you are aware it is a legal requirement that when a child is absent, the school requires a note on their return stating the reason for their absence. From time to time we know these maybe overlooked and for this reason reminder notices are sent out by the school. At the present time we have 76 outstanding notes from the beginning of the year to now. These appear as unexplained absences on your child's report if we are not able to record an explanation. Your attention to any outstanding notes is appreciated.



Send me to school if ...

- I have a sprain, strain or pain and I can function (walk, talk and eat)
- If I have asthma, diabetes, epilepsy etc-school personnel are trained to manage my condition. Talk to the school about my health plan
- I haven't vomited or had diarrhoea for 24 hours

Keep me home if ...

- I have a temperature higher than 37 degrees
- I am vomiting or have diarrhoea
- My eyes are red, and crusty (conjunctivitis)
- I have influenza (flu) combination fever, sore throat, cough, muscle aches and headaches

Parent/Student/Teacher Interviews

The School Interview booking site will be open on <u>Monday 3rd June at 9am</u>



for parents to make appointments with class teachers as part of the half yearly reporting cycle. Reports will be sent home with children on Monday 24th June 2019.

Interviews will take place from Tuesday 25th June 2019 with the late interview evening being Wednesday 26th June 2019.

The teachers look forward to this opportunity to meet with you and your child to discuss their learning and their goals. To assist with the smooth running of the interviews and to continue to respect the amount of time that parents are able to meet with teachers the following information is provided: -

- Interviews will be spaced at 15mins intervals, though it is not expected that most interviews will take up the whole 15mins
- Parents are requested to contact the teacher to schedule an appointment at another time if they need an extended interview that will take longer than 15 mins
- Parents who have more than one teacher to see are • asked not to book consecutive timeslots so as to avoid running late for the next appointment. The location of classrooms makes it impossible to move in time from one interview to the next if the appointment is booked back to back with another appointment
- If you are running late for your interview time, your interview can only take place for the booked time so as not to impact on the schedule of other interviews
- Teachers will have a commitment to the published Interview Timetable that appears outside each classroom/ learning space and they will appreciate parents also adhering to the time allocation

School Fees
