Social Skills—Weeks 5 & 6

Making Responsible Decisions At St. Bernadette's 'RESILIENT'

Learning to make good decisions enables children to develop independence and responsibility. A good decision is one that is most likely to lead to a positive outcome for everyone concerned. To make good decisions children must learn to:

- Recognise when there is a choice for them to make
- Understand they are responsible for making the decision
- Take other's needs into consideration
- Think of possible choices or solutions and decide what is best

Steps for decision-making:

- 1. What do you have to decide about?
- 2. What choices do you have?
- 3. Weigh up the pros and cons of each option and choose the best option.

Put your choice into action and then check how it works out.

Family Discussion:

Children will often focus on immediate wants without considering the long-term consequences of their decisions and actions. Parents can help children develop their decision-making skills by:

- Keeping decision-making manageable by providing a choice between two options that are realistic for the age and ability of the child.
- Listen enthusiastically to children's explanations and encourage children to explain their choices as this teaches them to develop their thinking processes and think through their choices.
- Use questions to encourage children to make judgements (eg. 'Do you think this will work?' 'Is that a good idea?'
- Involve children in family decision-making (eg. Planning holiday activities etc) This encourages children to take others into consideration when making decisions.
