The Gospels contain many parables of Jesus. Matthew even says, "All these things Jesus said to the crowd in parables and did not speak to them unless in parables" (Mt 13:34). This was a common method of teaching used in those days. It was in this way that Jesus made Himself understood by the people. In the parables, He starts from very ordinary things of life and uses them as terms of comparison to help people better understand the less known things of the Kingdom of God. In this Sunday's Gospel, Jesus starts with three well-known things in the lives of people: the treasure hidden in the field, the merchant who seeks pearls, and the dragnet that fishermen cast into the sea.

The parables of Jesus are a pedagogical device that uses daily life to show us how the things of daily life speak to us of God. The parables make reality transparent and reveal

the presence and action of God. They transform one's sight into a contemplative gaze. A parable is about the things of life and thus is an open teaching that involves us. We all have experience of the things of life. The teaching in parables begins with a person's experience of common things so as to be able to understand the Kingdom: seed, salt, light, sheep, flowers, woman, children, father, net, fish, treasure, pearl, etc.

Jesus did not usually explain His parables. Generally, He ended with this exhortation: "He who has ears to hear let him hear!" (Mt 11:15; 13:9, 43), or, "That's it. You've heard! Now try to understand!" Jesus left His parables open ended; He did not finish them. This is a sign that Jesus believed in the ability of people to discover the meaning of the parable starting from their own experience of life.



PBS4L Launch (Positive Behaviour Support 4 Learning)




On Monday St Bernadette's launched Bernie Roo, our PBS4L mascot. PBS4L is a school wide positive behaviour support approach that aims to develop positive social and learning outcomes. Bernie Roo reminds us that at St Bernadette's: We are Respectful, We are Resilient, We are Safe and We are Learners.

Students will earn Bernie Roo tokens in their learning spaces, on the playground, at going home arrangements, when visiting the office, in the library and anywhere else around the school they are seen displaying our school agreements. When the students receive a token they are told why they are receiving it, that is,

the agreement they are displaying to receive the token. This would be a great conversation starter at home for when your child/ren informs you they received a Bernie Roo token.

When a student receives a Bernie Roo token they then hand it into their classroom teacher who places a Bernie Roo stamp on the student's Bernie Roo card. When a student has received ten Bernie Roo tokens and therefore has ten stamps on their Bernie Roo card, they then bring their Bernie Roo card home and celebrate with you. There is no limit to the amount of Bernie Roo tokens and Bernie Roo certificates a student can receive.



Bernie Roo Certificate




It is important to note that lost tokens will not be replaced, the students are responsible for looking after them and handing them into their teacher.

A completed Bernie Roo card then receives a gem from the classroom teacher which is added to the class Bernie Roo jar. When the class jar reaches a certain level the whole class receives a reward. This reward is decided upon at a grade level by both the students and teachers and includes such things as extra play time, a games afternoon, extra sport, craft, free time, the list goes on.

The class gems are then tipped into the whole school container! When the school container reaches a certain level the whole school receives a reward. These rewards are currently being developed with the Student Representative Council.

At St Bernadette's Primary School we are dedicated to promoting our core values of being respectful, being resilient, being safe and being a learner, within our whole school community and thank you for your support.

Student Banking will resume next Wednesday after the Covid-19 crisis led the Commonwealth Bank to put a halt on the program.



Banking Co-ordinators will be using strict hygiene practices that will include hand sanitiser and gloves. All banking wallets will be also be sanitised before they are returned to the students. Please do not send in a deposit if you are unwell or have visited any Covid-19 hotspots in the 14 days prior to banking day.

With the pause of the program the bank acknowledges that students were unable to make deposits in the usual way and therefore missed out on receiving tokens for their deposits. During this time, parents may have transferred deposits directly, or even made deposits at local branches. To recognise their efforts, all students who make deposits will receive an ex-gratia reward item.
