Resilience ... it's a familiar word, isn't it? But what does it really mean?

When we talk about resilience, we're talking about a child's ability to cope with ups and downs, and bounce back from the challenges they experience during childhood - for example moving home, changing schools, studying for an exam or dealing with the death of a loved one. Building resilience helps children not only to deal with current difficulties that are a part of everyday life, but also to develop the basic skills and habits that will help them deal with challenges later in life, during adolescence and adulthood. Resilience is important for children's mental health. Children with greater resilience are better able to manage stress, which is a common response to difficult events. Stress is a risk factor for mental health conditions such as anxiety and depression, if the level of stress is severe or ongoing.

We can all help children become more resilient and the good news is, you don't have to do it alone. You can ask other adults such as carers and grandparents to help. Building children's resilience is everyone's business, and it's never too early or too late

to get started. We've got some simple things that you can do in your own home.

How can I build resilience in my child?

The planning of the new curriculum involved RE teachers across the Diocese, Parish Priests, Teacher Educators from Catholic Education and Theologian Anthony Maher. At the moment it is in draft form. The final version of the curriculum will only be implemented once the review and consultation process is complete. If changes need to be made, we will ensure this happens.

The draft RE Curriculum at St. Bernadette's has first been trialed with Stage 2, this Term. Stage 3 will Trial a learning Cycle in Term 4 and Stage 1 and Early Stage 1 next year. Before teaching the Learning Cycle each Stage has had a number of planning Days with myself and the Teacher Educator from the Catholic Education Office.

I know that issues about the new curriculum that have been raised in the media have caused concern but it is important to remember that the content is based on Scripture and the Catholic Faith. The children contemplate the content and then act in their school, home and community so they are living out the values Jesus teaches us in the Scriptures in their actions.
