R.E. NEWS



This weekend we begin the season of Advent, which marks the start of a new liturgical year for the Church. The readings for Sunday Mass are arranged on a three-year cycle. Each year features a different Gospel—Matthew, Mark, or Luke. Readings from the Gospel of John are interspersed throughout all three years. With this year's first Sunday of Advent, we begin Cycle B of the Lectionary, which focuses our attention on the Gospel of Mark. This week and next week, our readings from Mark's Gospel present two important Advent themes: the Lord's return at the end of time and John the Baptist's preparation for Jesus.

Scholars believe that Mark's Gospel was written around the time of the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in A.D. 70. Mark's audience consisted of Christians who were living in difficult social and political times, times of conflict. They were likely beginning to face persecution as followers of Jesus. In this difficult time, it helped to recall that Jesus had foretold of such difficulties. Early Christian communities took courage from Jesus' warning to remain alert and watchful, and they found in his words a way to persevere through suffering.

Today's Gospel reminds us that Advent is about more than our preparation for the Church's celebration of Christ's birth at Christmas. Advent is also about preparing ourselves for Christ's return in glory at the end of time.

Bernie Roo Update

At the beginning of Term Three we launched our whole school Positive Behaviour Support for Learning initiative - 'St Bernadette's Expectations', and our mascot Bernie Roo. This initiative supports us with teaching our school to follow our school agreements of- At St. Bernadette's: We are Respectful, We are Resilient, We are Safe and We are Learners. Students earn "Bernie Roo" tokens in their learning spaces and on the playground for displaying our school agreements.



When students display these agreements they earn "Bernie Roo" tokens within the classroom and on the playground. They receive an acknowledgment of this by a stamp on their Bernie Roo card. Once students have reached 10 stamps they receive a gem which is added to the class gem jar to earn whole class rewards. When the class jar has reached a certain level, the gems are then added to the whole school gem jar to reach a whole school reward.

Notice from NSW Roads - Showground Road

The Australian Government and NSW Governments are taking action to improve the reliability and efficiency of bus services, while easing congestion and improving safety for all road users.

Transport for NSW is upgrading the intersections of Showground Road at Carrington Road and De Clambe Drive and widening Showground Road and Carrington Road to provide extra turning lanes and bus lanes.


They will start work on Sunday 29 November.

Their work will involve:

- establishing the site compound on the western corner of Showground Road and De Clambe Drive
- installing traffic controls, such as barriers, signs and temporary line marking, along Showground Road and Carrington Road
- undertaking road and utility investigations
- removing the central concrete medians along Showground Road and Carrington Road
- installing a new storm water drainage system under Showground Road
- removing trees and other vegetation.

This project will be completed in August 2022. More information is on the attached flyer.
