Children's Liturgy of the Word is when the children leave the congregation to celebrate and reflect on the Sunday Gospel reading in an age appropriate way. The children are led through prayers and readings that are adapted to their level of understanding.

Attending Mass together is a part of being a Catholic family, while Children's Liturgy of the Word allows children to enter the celebration more fully by catering to their needs.

In St Bernadette's Parish, a feature of the 9am Sunday mass (which is now back) is the withdrawal of the children from the ages of

5 to 11 years old to celebrate the Liturgy of the Word. This is set out in Directory of Masses for Children, which



is an important document for CHILDREN'S

the guidelines and principles Liturgy of the Word so that the liturgy can be adapted for the children's level of understanding. The Directory states: Sometimes..., if the place itself and the nature of the community permit, it will be appropriate to celebrate the liturgy of the word, including a homily, with the children in a separate, but not too distant, room. Then, before the Eucharistic liturgy begins, the children are led to the place with the adults and meanwhile celebrate their own liturgy of the word.

In Castle Hill, we have a wonderful group of catechists who lead the children in the scripture and breaking open the readings to help them understand the meaning, apply it to their lives and give the children a chance to respond. At 9am mass, it is a wonderful opportunity for the children of our parish to experience the Word of God at their level of understanding. Parents can also assist children to engage more fully in the Sunday Gospel by looking up the weekly readings prior to attending Sunday Mass. Mrs Shane Robinson—REC

#### **Mid Year Reports**

Teachers are currently working on the student Mid

Year Reports, which will be sent home to parents on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> June. Parent Teacher Interviews will be available by appointment in Week 10-, 21<sup>st</sup>-25<sup>th</sup> June (booking details to come closer to the date) The reports will have the same format as at the end of last year.



All students will receive a level of achievement in each Key Learning Area (subject) based on a scale described by the words:

Working With Assistance, Working Towards, Working At, Working Beyond or Working Deeply.

There will also be an effort grade displayed in each Key Learning Area. Comments will be written for Religious Education, English, Mathematics as well as a General Comment.

It is important to remember that the majority of students are expected to receive **Working At** grades which indicate that they are achieving the expected outcomes.

A lot of time and consideration is put into allocating the grades for each student. Grades are allocated based on a number of variables such as student work samples, assessment tasks, observations and class work. Please keep in mind that your child's grades may have varied from previous years, especially if they have moved into a new stage this year (Year 1, Year 3, Year 5).

## Head to Toe Donation Day

Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June (Feast of the Sacred Heart)

The St Vincent de Paul Society have launched their Winter Appeal. National President Claire Victory said that historically low wages and cuts to income support, coupled with rising house prices and the decline in affordable rental accommodation, are pushing more families into homelessness.

'As temperatures drop, more people are living in cars, couch surfing or sleeping in situations that put them at risk.'

'It has also placed 124,000 more families at increased risk of homelessness, with low wage earners, casual workers and single parents experiencing greater rates of job insecurity and lost income than other groups. That means more than 25,000 children under the age of 18 face homelessness each night. As children move from one temporary accommodation to another, routines are lost, friendships are broken and education suffers. The critical years of childhood become filled with trauma, with long-term impacts for the future.'

The St Bernadette's Mini Vinnies is holding a fundraiser to try and raise funds for those who are homeless. Every \$22 raised, provides the funds for safe accommodation for a night.

On **Friday 11<sup>th</sup> June** children who come dressed **Head to Toe in warm clothes** are asked to bring a donation to support the Vinnies Winter appeal.
