Just as we mark our lives by anniversaries, the Church celebrates the mysteries of Christ's life in a pattern. Within the cycle of a year the Church remembers and celebrates the Paschal Mystery, the birth, life, suffering, death, Resurrection and Ascension of Jesus. The Church's liturgical cycle recalls the Paschal Mystery over a yearly cycle. At Mass we also remember the Paschal Mystery and are constantly nourished by the story of Jesus and the body

and blood of Jesus in the Eucharist.

The seasons are Advent, Christmas, Lent and Easter. On May 30th we celebrated the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. This celebrated one of

the oldest traditions of the church, to call God by the names of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. These are the three persons of the Holy Trinity.

Apart from these seasons, there are 33 or 34 weeks of the year that do not celebrate a particular aspect of the mystery of Christ but are devoted to the mystery of Christ in all its aspects. This period of the Church calendar is called Ordinary Time, which is the period we are now in. The liturgical colour for Ordinary Time is green. This Sunday we will celebrate Mass for the 12th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

In every classroom the prayer table is also covered with a coloured cloth to reflect the Liturgical season.

As each grade attends the Parish Mass on a Friday they are noticing that the altar cloth has a particular colour as do the priest vestments. The colour of these will match the season of the church unless it a Solemnity or Feast Day and then the colour could be red or white.

When we are kind we fill the other person's bucket as well as our own. Our bucket (our wellbeing) is a sign of how we are feeling. We all agreed we don't want to be a 'bucket dipper'. These are the times we are not kind.
