This Sunday is the second Sunday of Advent. We light another purple candle on the Advent wreath to represent the hope of Christ coming to the world. The word 'hope' has two meanings in the Bible. The first, tiqvah, contains the sense of eager anticipation or waiting. The second, elpis, depicts a sense of confident expectation based on certainty. Biblical hope is secured by God's faithfulness to His promises. For the Old Testament leaders,

their hope was in the Messiah's arrival. For us, it is the hope of the Messiah's return.

The children know and understand that Advent is a time of waiting and preparing for the birth of our saviour.

Here are some suggestions for activities to do during the month of December through the season of Advent.

1.Make an Advent wreath at home – you will need 3 purple candles, one pink candle and one white candle for the middle of the wreath and use this as a focus for your family prayer.

2. Read the Scripture of the day and discuss the message God and what it means for our lives.

Dear Parents, Grandparents and Guardians,

Wellbeing lessons this week looked at the power of our breath. Breathing has been part of mindfulness activities since ancient times and is part of every relaxation, calming and meditation practice.

This week we spoke about how powerful our breath can be and in some cases even 'magic'. By concentrating on our breathing and controlling our breaths we are able to slow our heart rate down, lower our anxiety levels and



clear our mind of thoughts. Research has shown that controlling your breath can help to increase your ability to learn.

Most classes this week had the opportunity to make a *Breathing Stick*. It is a simple tool to guide us as we are breathing. We breathe in deeply through the nose and out very slowly through our mouth, as we breathe out we move the bead from one side to the other side very slowly in sync as we exhale. We spoke about the times when the *Breathing Stick* could help us calm down and refocus and how it would be very handy when we are anxious, 'out of sorts' or even to help us sleep. Have a practice at home.

Thank you again for your wonderful generosity in supporting those families who are less fortunate.


