On Sunday 15th August we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption and we remember that Mary is in heaven with God.

On November 1, 1950, Pius XII defined the

dogma of the Assumption.
Thus he solemnly
proclaimed that the belief
whereby the Blessed Virgin
Mary, at the close of her
earthly life, was taken up,
body and soul, into the
glory of heaven, definitively
forms part of the deposit of

faith, received from the Apostles. To avoid all that is uncertain the Pope did not state either the manner or the circumstances of time and place in which the Assumption took place — only the fact of the Assumption of Mary, body and soul, into the glory of heaven, is the matter of the definition.

One of the many reasons why Mary is so important to God is that she always recognised the ways in which God was working in her life. She saw the good things that God was doing and praised God for these things. She also said "yes" to God even when she was scared.

On Sunday 15th you could listen to or read Luke's Gospel, Luke 1:39:56.




I remember attending a lecture by Michael Carr-Gregg called *Raising Happy and Resilient Children*. You have probably already heard of Dr Carr-Gregg. He is a psychologist who works with children and adolescents, specialising in the area of parenting adolescents and adolescent mental health. He has written many books on the subject and can often be seen on Sunrise, Channel Seven.

He defined resilience as the capacity to face, overcome and be strengthened by adversity. He encouraged us not to shield children from adversity and gave us some ideas about how to encourage resilience in our children.

#### They were:

- having a charismatic adult in their life from which they can draw strength. This may be a parent or could be another adult (friend or family member) who is a positive role model for them
- developing the ability to solve problems, manage anger etc usually by modelling the behaviour yourself
- teaching positive self talk for improved confidence and selfesteem
- find something that interests them, where they get positive recognition from their peers. In other words, help them to find their **spark**, whether it be an interest in art, music, dance, drama, sport etc.



And finally spirituality - children that are bound to a belief system feel a sense of connectedness and part of something bigger than themselves and we are lucky to have our Catholic beliefs that help us through tough times especially at the moment.

This term bookclub will be a little different, and we are so excited to be able to offer Bookclub during these unprecedent times.



#### KINDERGARTEN & **Years 1 to 6 2022**


Have you enrolled your child for Kindergarten 2022? If not, limited places remain for next year's Kindergarten intake. Interviews are now taking place with

#### Please update your contact details

On Monday 16 August you will receive an email or SMS (for those parents without email) from Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) asking you to review and, where necessary, update the key information they hold about your children currently enrolled in CEDP schools.



Steps have been taken to ensure this process is as secure as possible to protect your information and your family's privacy. Your information is only accessed by authorised staff when it is necessary and in accordance with our Privacy Policy.

The link is open until Friday 3 September and I encourage you to complete the review/update as soon as possible to ensure that your family's correct details are on file. This is particularly important as Greater Sydney remains in lockdown due to the COVID-19 outbreak.

Only one person per family needs to complete the survey and it takes about 15 minutes to complete. If you have any questions or to seek help, please contact the CEDP Community Liaison Team on 9840 5796.
