TATAT

Through prayer we are being called into a dialogue with God. Lent is a time to focus on prayer, so we can build that relationship with God. A first step is that we need to make a commitment for a time and place to pray. But how to pray? How to find God's voice inside our noisy minds and busy schedules? How to quiet down and listen?

'Lectio divina' is an ancient form of prayer that's accessible to all. The church provides daily Scripture readings that can be the gateway to prayer.

Choose a daily reading and go through it slowly. Pause and recall a word or phrase that particularly speaks to you. Spend time reflecting on what moves you. Then slowly read the entire text again to put the phrase into context and explore deeper meaning. You could read and reflect on this Sunday's

Gospel, Luke 9:28-36 which is he Transfiguration.

The experience of the

Transfiguration had a very important significance in the life of Jesus and of the disciples. It helped them overcome the crisis of faith and to change their ideals concerning the Messiah.

Here are some reflection questions for you to reflect on the Scripture:

- 1. Jesus took Peter, James and John up to a mountain. Where do you like to pray? What do you like about praying alone and with others?
- 2.In the Gospel, Peter, James and John have a powerful, unforgettable and indescribable experience of God. Have you ever had an experience of God that transformed your life? If not, share a time when you felt especially close to God.
- 3. Also in the Gospel, the three apostles are told to listen to Jesus. How do you go about listening to Jesus?
- 4. What is the one thing Jesus is saying to us in this Sunday's Gospel about how a disciple should speak or act?

people can show intelligence. We often use the term 'smart', so we talked about being word smart, math smart, people smart or music smart etc.

The students decided that everyone has one or more kinds of 'smart' and that no 'smart' was better than the rest. Knowing what you are good at or smart at, can help you form a better understanding of your identity.


Harmony Day 2022—Friday 25th March
