Naplan 2022

The NAPLAN 2022 testing window is May 10-20. We will publicise our specific schedule closer to the time.

Next week we will conduct our NAPLAN online Practice tests. These are only designed to test our system capabilities and to provide students with an experience of the testing environment. The practice tests are all conducted online and are NOT marked and no feedback is provided, however, our teachers will monitor students to observe any generalisations.

Year 5 will participate in 2 papers- an Omnibus on Tuesday (Mixed questions) and a Writing sample on Thursday. Year 3 will only participate in an Omnibus on Thursday as they will complete the Writing sample on paper for NAPLAN (not online).

In Week 9 as our Primary students attend the cross country, all Infants will participate in 2 lessons throughout the day. On Monday of Week 10 all Primary students will receive 2 lessons throughout the day. 


St Bernadette's Magic Square


