

Dear Parents, Grandparents and Guardians,

We continued our lessons about kindness this week. The children shared some of the kind things they have done and the kindness they have received since last week. We talked about the feelings we get inside when we experience kindness. It's priceless. We also realised that we feel good when we witness kindness.

We discussed what to do if someone is unkind. We did an experiment during a roleplay and witnessed first hand how we can react to unkind words and turn the tables on the person who is not being nice. Ask your children to explain or even roleplay it with them. We realised that when someone is unkind, our first reaction is to be unkind back. An opportunity for forgiveness is possible if we choose to react in a kind way. I agreed with the children that it is hard but it can be done.

We revisited a favourite story about being bucket fillers. Have a look at the story, it is a great way to explain the power of kindness. <u>Have you filled a bucket</u> today?
