This year we mark 6 years since Pope Francis released the highly influential encyclical, Laudato Si. In acknowledgement of this, our global church has called on its members to acknowledge and celebrate Laudato Si Week, beginning on May 16 and concluding on May 24.

Pope Francis' Encyclical Laudato Si was a worldwide wake up call to help humanity understand the destruction that man is rendering to the environment and his fellow man. While addressing the environment directly, the document's scope is broader in many ways as it looks at not only man's effect on the environment, but also the many philosophical, theological, and cultural causes that threaten the relationships of man to nature and man to each other in various circumstances.

The document was in many ways the epitome of Pope Francis. It is an unexpected topic. It presents Gospel truths, and, it provides a challenge for everyone. We're living through history-shaping events. The Laudato Si' teaches us how to build a better world-together. This week we focused on emotions. We described them as feelings that people have when they have different thoughts and are in different situations.

When an emotion is triggered, what actually happens? Well scientists have learned that an "emotional reaction" actually has many different parts.

- 1. The brain changes what happens in our body (smile, goosebumps, butterflies, tears)
- 2. You start to think differently (thinking sad or happy memories)
- 3. You want to behave differently (run away, scream, jump with joy)

The reason why it is important for students to be able to identify their emotions is so that they can boost positive feelings or manage negative feelings. By knowing what gives positive feelings, they can aim to do more of these actions and by understanding their negative

feelings they can make a plan for how to manage them. Just putting a name to an emotion is a powerful way to deal with feelings.



Sometimes we need to help them by naming the emotion-"you must feel really

disappointed when you missed out" or "you must have felt really angry when you lost the game".

The most important take home message is that all emotions are ok even the unpleasant ones and they happen to all of us.
