I highly recommend that all families take the time to explore the eSafety website.



On Monday 8th August we celebrate the Feast of St Mary MacKillop, our first Australian saint. It is a perfect time to reflect on her achievements as well as the obstacles she encountered.



She was the cofounder the Sisters of St Joseph and a tireless advocate of education and schools. At just 24, she established a school for children of the poor and underprivileged and

under her guidance, her Order went on to found schools not only across SA but also in Victoria, NSW and eventually New Zealand.

St Mary and her Sisters were also responsible for setting up orphanages and homes for the destitute as well as establishing refuges for ex-inmates of Australia's grim nineteenth century prisons. She also set up shelters for former prostitutes earning criticism and outrage from many people.

In a conservative time as well as a male dominated Church, St Mary's unwavering commitment to those on the margins of society constantly met with opposition. But with her strength of faith and her vision of a better world for all, St Mary refused to be daunted. With patience, a forgiving heart and trust in God, she managed to overcome whatever obstacles were put her way.

We strive to be like her in our daily lives. On Monday 8th August the school will celebrate the Feast day of St. Mary MacKillop with mass in the church at 9am. Parents are welcome to attend.

Dear Parents, Grandparents and Guardians,

This week in Wellbeing Kindy learnt that controlling

our breath can be magic and they made a 'breathing stick' to help them concentrate on breathing in and out. By concentrating on our breathing and controlling our breaths we are able to slow our



heart rate down, lower our anxiety levels and clear our mind of thoughts. Research has shown that controlling your breath can help to increase your ability to learn.

Empathy was the focus for all our other students. We talked about how empathy enables us to relate to other people and their experiences, helps us to understand others and it's what makes us compassionate. Empathy can make us courageous to stand up for others who are

being bullied, it helps us make strong social connections and makes us happier. Empathy involves problem solving and putting themselves into another person's shoes. We watched some short videos that helped them understand what empathy looks like.

2022 School Fees

Term 3 School Fee accounts have now been sent home to all families last week from the Catholic Education Office. All Fees and Charges are due and payable 30 days from the date of the School Tax Invoice / Statement unless a payment arrangement is agreed to by the school in writing prior to the Current Term Fees - Due date, Wednesday, 24th August, 2022. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment.

Fees can be made by EFTPOS, BPOINT, BPAY or POSTBILLPAY- (NO CASH OR CHEQUES). If you take advantage of the BPAY facility to pay your school fees, you will need your biller code and reference code which are located on the bottom righthand side of your school fee account.

Please allow 2 days for all BPoint, BPay and POSTBILLPAY payments to reach our account. Should you wish to make other arrangements for the payment of your 2022 school fees please contact Mrs Vicki Cassidy on 94076600 or email vcassidy@parra.catholic.edu.au.

Withdrawal of a Student—A full terms notice (10 school weeks) in writing must be given to the Principal before a parent / guardian terminates the Student's enrolment. If sufficient notice of termination of the Student's enrolment is not given, the parent / guardian is to pay the School one term's school fees including any Diocesan Fees applicable. This amount reflects the School's financial loss associated with the Student's withdrawal without sufficient notice of termination. One exception is that notice in writing will be accepted at any time during Term 4 in relation to the following year's enrolment
